4. Obstacles to Closeness With God.

▶ Independence: Living life on our own, apart from God. 1 Peter 2:25

► Fear: Flight, fear, terror. 1 John 4:18

Guilt: Held in, bound by, liable to a charge or action.
Romans 8:1, 34

► Shame: Dishonor, disgrace. Philippians 3:18-19

Shame: "Intensely painful feeling or experience. Believing we are flawed and unworthy of love and belonging. Something we've experienced, done, or failed to do makes us unworthy of connection." Brene Brown

► False Views of Prayer: Matthew. 6:5-7, Luke 18:10-14

In order for God to hear and answer my prayers, I must:

- Pray "Right": Use the Right words, posture, mindset, etc.
- Be "Right": Have right church position, training, status or level of spirituality, etc.

6. Create a Male Context - An Environment Where Men Thrive.

From Why Men Hate Going to Church, D. Murrow, 2005, pp. 156-160

Male Context Characteristics

- a. Men follow men.
- b. Men need **male leadership.** They are looking for **men who will lead them to greatness.**
- **c. Men will not lead** in areas where they do not feel **equipped** and **competent**.
- d. Men need vision.
- e. Men need purpose
- f. Men respond **positively to being** discipled.
- g. Men are visual and want to conquer territory.
- ▶ Give men a good target to pray for. Something to accomplish, to be overcome.
- Invite them to where you want to see God work and see the impact of their prayers and labor.
