 - A Men's Advocate helps create environments where men thrive. T. Bush
- 2. Create a "Male Context" An Environment Where Men Thrive

Male Context Characteristics:

a. Men follow men. Men need male leadership. They are looking for men who will lead them to greatness. C. Men will not lead in areas where they do not feel equipped and competent. D. Men need vision and purpose. E. Men respond positively to being discipled. F. Men are visual and want to conquer territory.

► Give men a good target to pray and act toward. Something to accomplish, to be overcome.

► Invite them to where you want to see God work and see the impact of their prayers and labor.

3. Engage the "Warrior Spirit" in Men (Born to Be A Warrior, Commander John Barnes)

"Warrior Spirit: The passionate desire and determination in the heart of a man to prepare and perfect himself for the stance against evil in the service of others.
